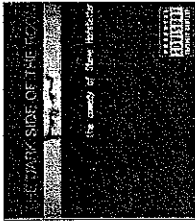

Sharp performs for children's wishes

Holiday Inn Gettysburg employees wants to grant children's wishes in York and Adams counties.

Because of the employees' dedication, 100 percent of the proceeds at an upcoming Kevin Sharp concert goes directly to the Make-A-Wish Foundation. Sharp, a country recording artist and motivational speaker, comes to the Eichelberger Performing Arts Center Jan. 11 to share his music and stories.

The employees raised the money for the event by holding a yard sale, sub and pizza sales and even an auction at their Christmas party, according to Sherri Keller, director of operations at the Delaware Hotel Group.

For 18 employees, they raised \$300 from their auction alone, proving to Keller that "it wasn't the gift, it's where the money was going."

And Sharp understands where the money is going. A cancer survivor himself, Sharp was granted a wish as a teenager, when his condition was life-threatening. His wish—to meet producer/performer David Foster.

He believes his wish kept him alive through chemotherapy, radiation treatments and experimental drugs.

Sharp went into remission in 1991, and now says, he doesn't worry about himself, just others. "I don't necessarily worry about my future," Sharp said. "I worry about our future as a society. Life kind of has some ideas of its own, and the good Lord just kind of helps to make you through each of those points in your life."

"I try not to really worry about my own life. It can't get any worse than it's been at times. When it comes along, I just sit on my chin up, and say, 'bring it on.'"

He spends much of his time serving as a role model for children with cancer, according to Keller.

When he visited Hanover last May for the annual Truck
